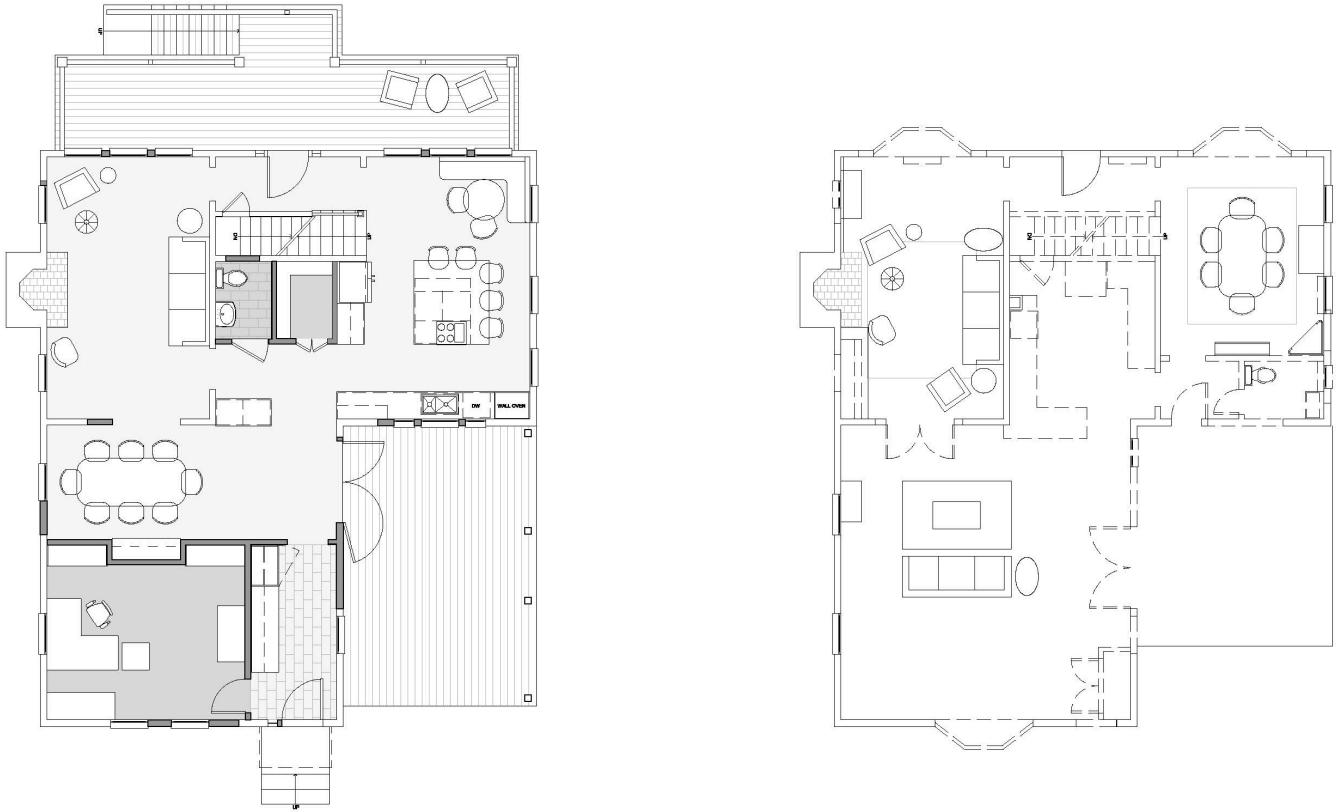

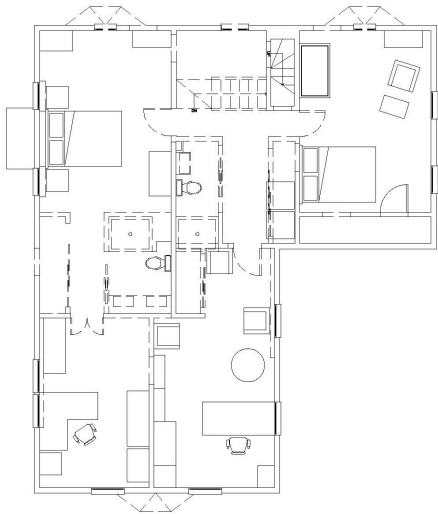
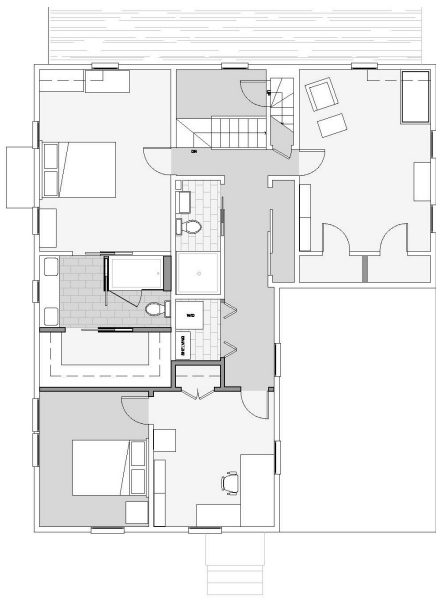

A young professional couple approached us to help them reorient the interior spaces of their house to take advantage of incredible water views, and to improve the flow between rooms to accommodate the arrival of a new child. To this end, we devised a range of possible plan reconfigurations and proposed adding dormers and a deep farmer's porch to the front of the house. To ensure a contextual relationship between the new exterior and the surrounding structures, we analyzed local precedents in the town's Old and Historic District. We also worked with the wife, a landscape architect, to stitch together new interior and exterior circulation pathways, the porch, and a new terrace to allow holistic indoor/outdoor living. A new exterior structure in the garden supports this outdoor living, functioning as a workshop, potting shed, and storage for canoes, bikes, kayaks and other equipment.
